What is the project about?

The Australian Government funds a range of carer support programs, and this survey will collect the views and experiences of Australian carers on Carer Gateway.

This survey will be a part of a larger evaluation that will provide information on three carer support programs:

- Carer Gateway
- the Young Carer Bursary Program and Young Carers Network
- Your Caring Way.

The purpose of the evaluation is to assess how the programs are meeting carer support needs and if they are improving wellbeing and participation for carers.

Who is conducting the evaluation?

This project is being conducted over the period of April 2022 to June 2024.

The evaluation is funded by the Department of Social Services.

Why have I been invited to participate?

You were selected to participate in this survey because you are registered with Carer Gateway. Your personal information is protected by law, including the Privacy Act 1988. All information you provide is confidential and will be used for evaluation **purposes only**. Participation in this evaluation is **voluntary** and **will not affect any government assistance, services or income support you receive**.

Do I have to participate?

Participation in this evaluation is entirely voluntary, meaning if you don't want to participate, you do not have to. You can decide at any time during the evaluation that you no longer wish to participate, you do not have to say why. If you withdraw by February 2024, your deidentified survey data will not be provided to the Australian Government.

No-one will know that you have participated in the survey.

Intellectual Property for the project data and copyright will be held by the Department of Social Services. The Department may reuse survey data in future evaluations of carer support programs.

The researchers will send you with a copy of the summary of the evaluation report if you provide either an email address or postal address at the end of the survey.

How will my information be kept confidential?

All information you provide will be kept confidential and used for this evaluation and future evaluations. All data will be de-identified in any reporting. This means no names or other identifying information will be used. Your personal information is protected by the Privacy Act 1988.

The UNSW, SRC and Ipsos ATSIURU uphold their obligations and participants' rights under the Australian Privacy Principles (APP). We will not disclose any personal information or personally identifiable information to a third party for a purpose other than conducting this evaluation unless we have your express prior consent or are required to do so by an Australian law or a court/ tribunal order.

All data will be secured in folders (electronic) only accessible by password or key by identified researchers. All data collection will be undertaken in accordance with The Research Society Code of Practice, ISO 20252 Standards and the Market and Social Research Privacy Principles. The University of New South Wales, The Social Research Centre and Ipsos ATSIURU are fully compliant with the Australian Privacy Principles.

The information will be kept for a minimum of 7 years after the completion of the evaluation.

UNSW will also provide an electronic copy of survey data to the Department of Social Services where it will be stored in a password protected system. This copy will not contain any identifying information about you.
